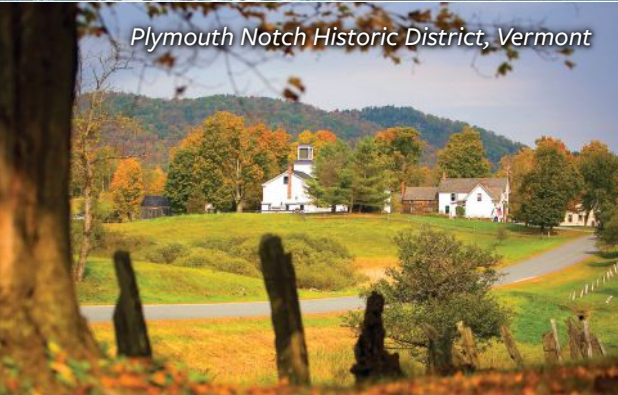

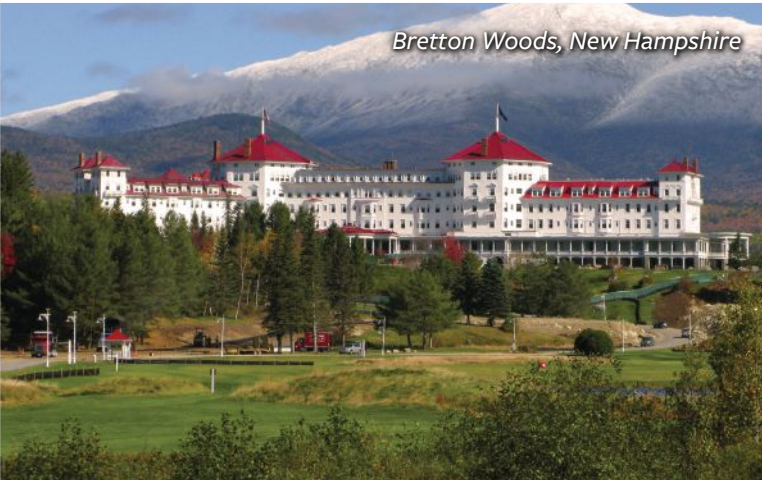






Discover new ways to relax and indulge

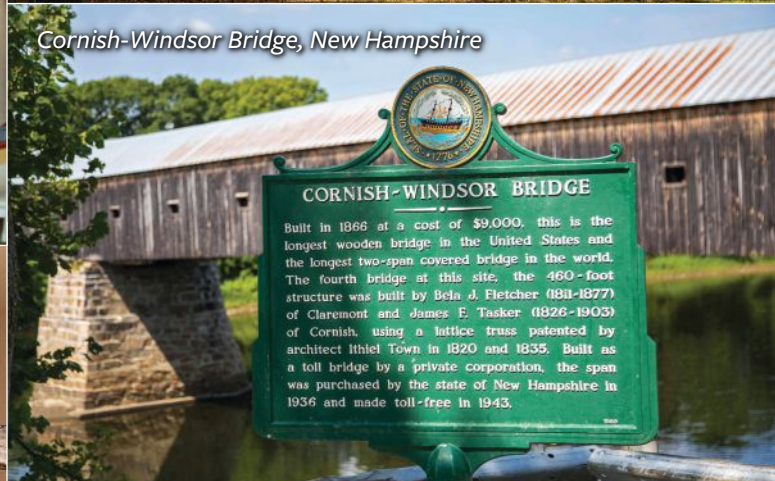

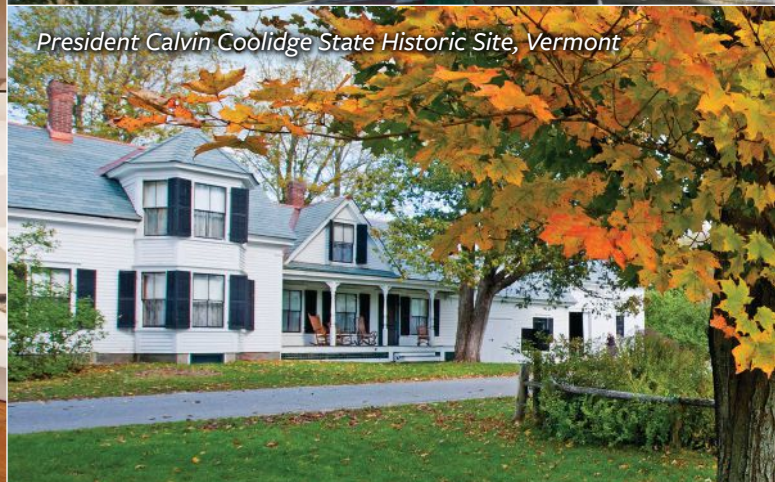

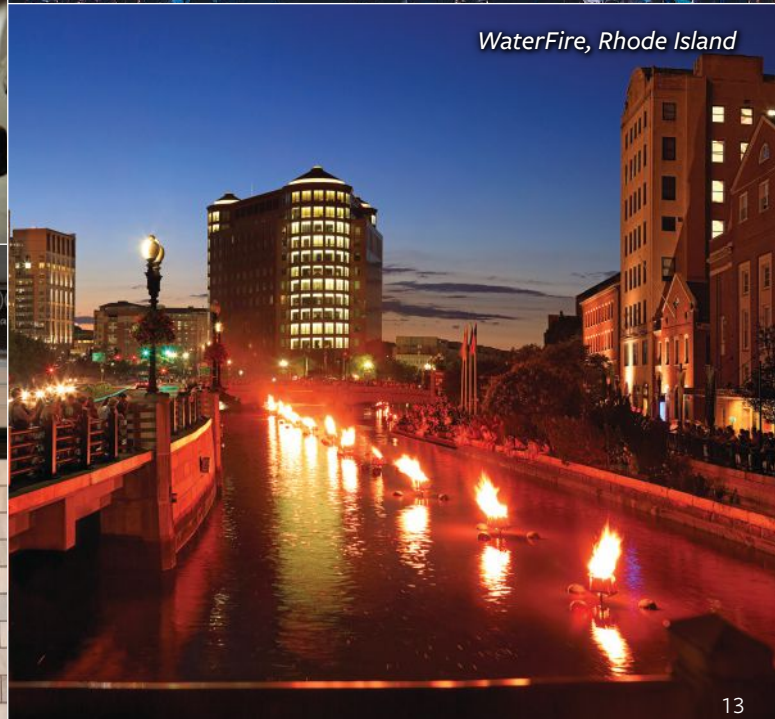

How to Discover New England

Concentrated in one captivating region, New England's size and transportation options make it easy to visit by plane, train or car. For more information, ask a travel professional or visit DiscoverNewEngland.org.

Getting around



By plane

New England's principal international gateway is Boston's Logan Airport, but the area is also serviced by international airports in Connecticut and Rhode Island, as well as New York's JFK and Canada's Montréal-Trudeau International Airport. Regional airports include New Hampshire's Manchester-Boston Regional Airport, Maine's Portland International Jetport and Burlington International Airport in Vermont.



By train

Coastal New England from New York to Maine is served by Amtrak's Northeast Regional and Downeaster lines, while the Vermonter travels through interior Connecticut, Massachusetts and Vermont. The Ethan Allen Express goes from Vermont to New York, and there are also local rail routes in each state. Visit Amtrak.com to learn more.



By car

Rent a car easily from any airport, and explore the entire region using well-mapped highways and roads.

Four seasons of fun



Summer (late June, July, August)

Average temperature: 70°–85° F (20°–29° C)

Spend the summer on one of hundreds of public beaches, or go into the woods and hike, bike or even camp out under the stars.



Fall (September – early November)

Average temperature: 45°–55° F (7°–12° C)

Enjoy the world's most colorful fall, with leaf viewing mid-September to mid-October, and don't miss apple and pumpkin seasons too.



Winter (mid-November – end of March)

Average temperature: 25°–32° F (-3°–0° C)

Skiers, snow boarders and snow lovers can expect between 35 and 100 inches per year, with higher totals in mountains and northernmost regions.



Spring (April, May, early June)

Average temperature: 40°–60° F (4°–15° C)

Gardens and nature trails come to life as New England bursts out in color, from daffodils and tulips to fields of wildflowers.

Language: English

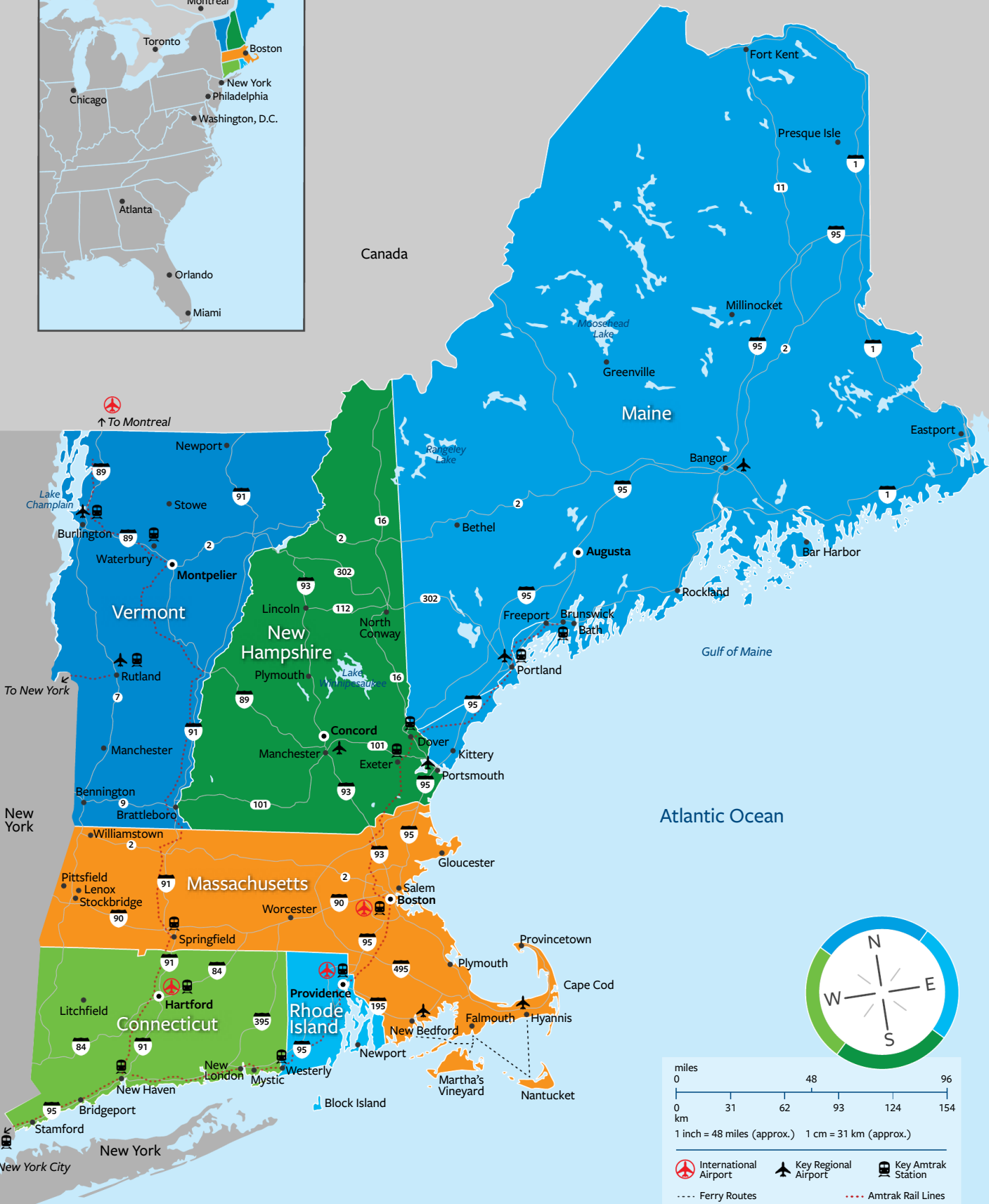
Currency: U.S. Dollar. The official rate of exchange fluctuates daily, depending on the foreign exchange markets. Please check xe.com for current exchange rates.

Time Zone: New England operates in the Eastern Standard Time Zone (EST). Daylight Saving Time is observed, which means clocks are turned one hour back in fall and one hour forward in spring. Check for dates.

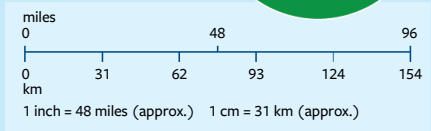
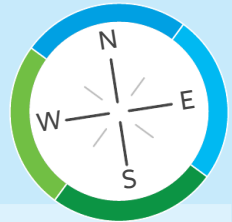
